So “MOC” was never just an acronym. It was a signal. A direct connection to the world the company was built to serve.

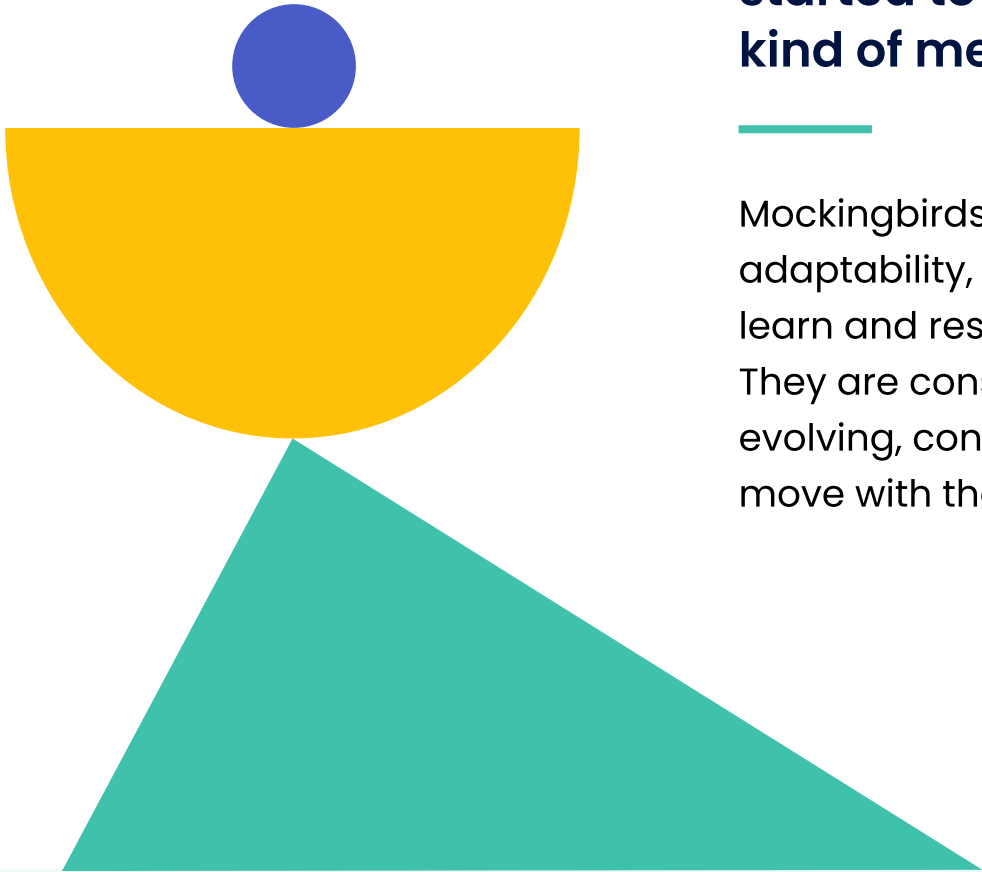
And then there is the part of the story no one forgets.
